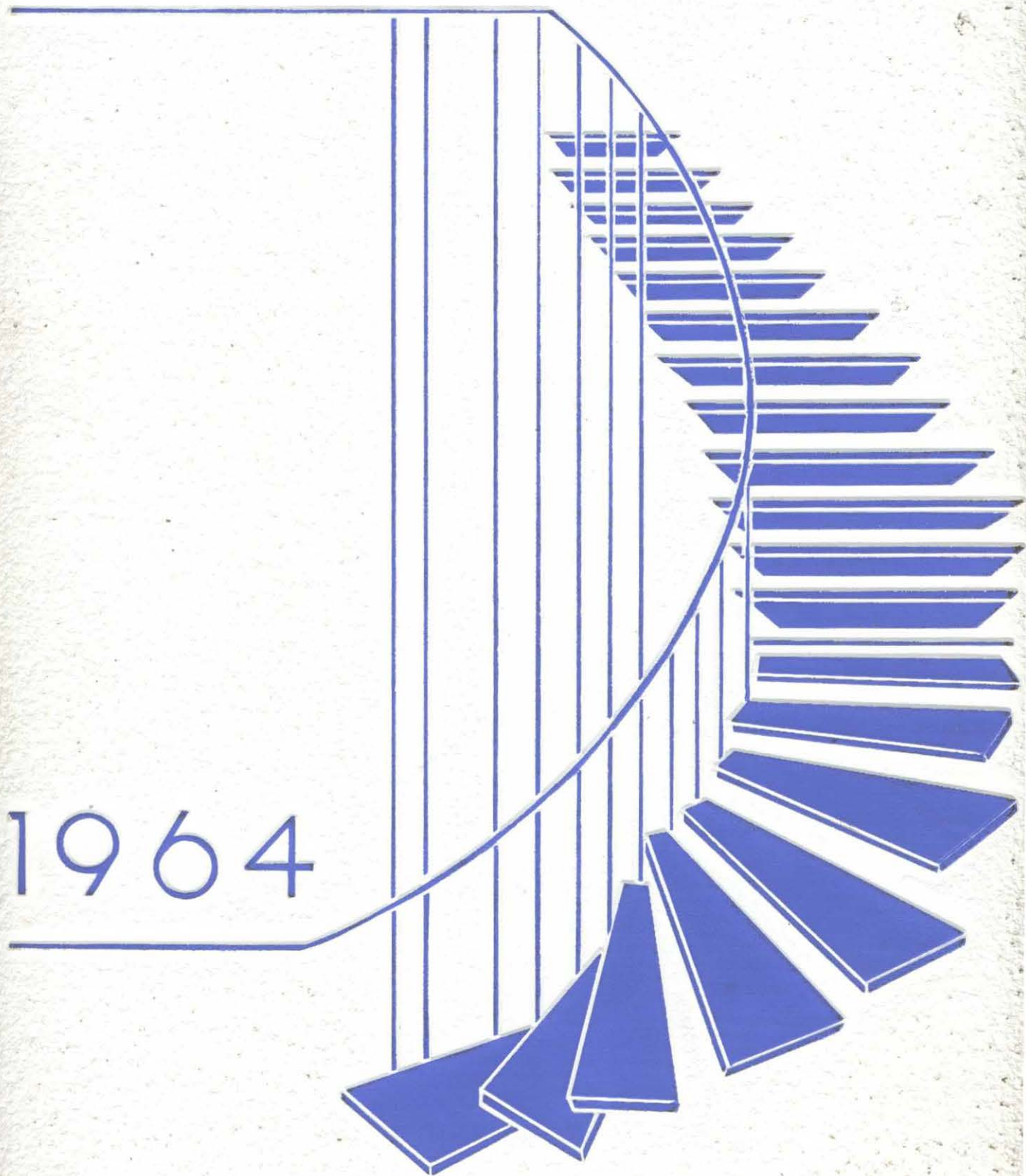

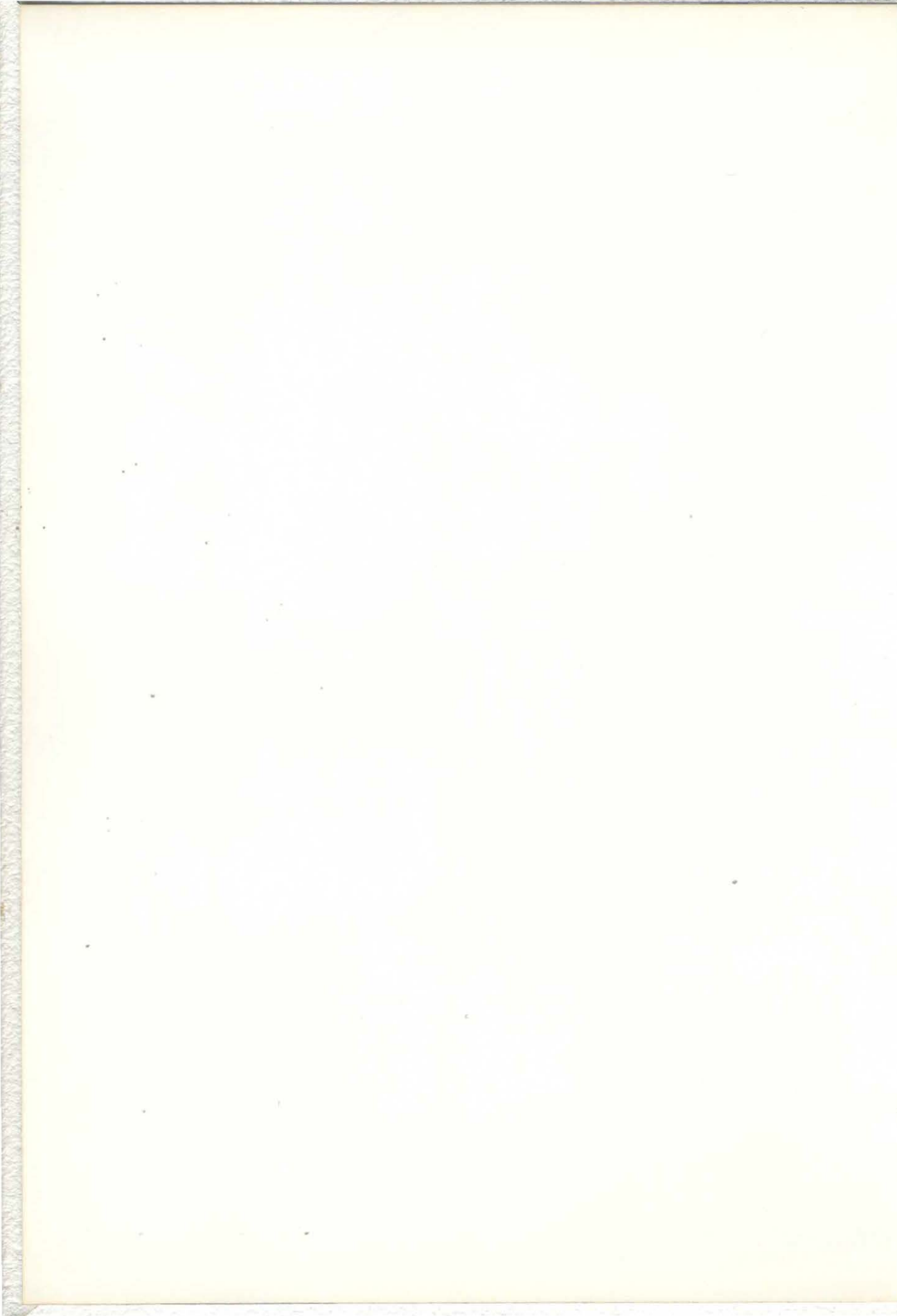

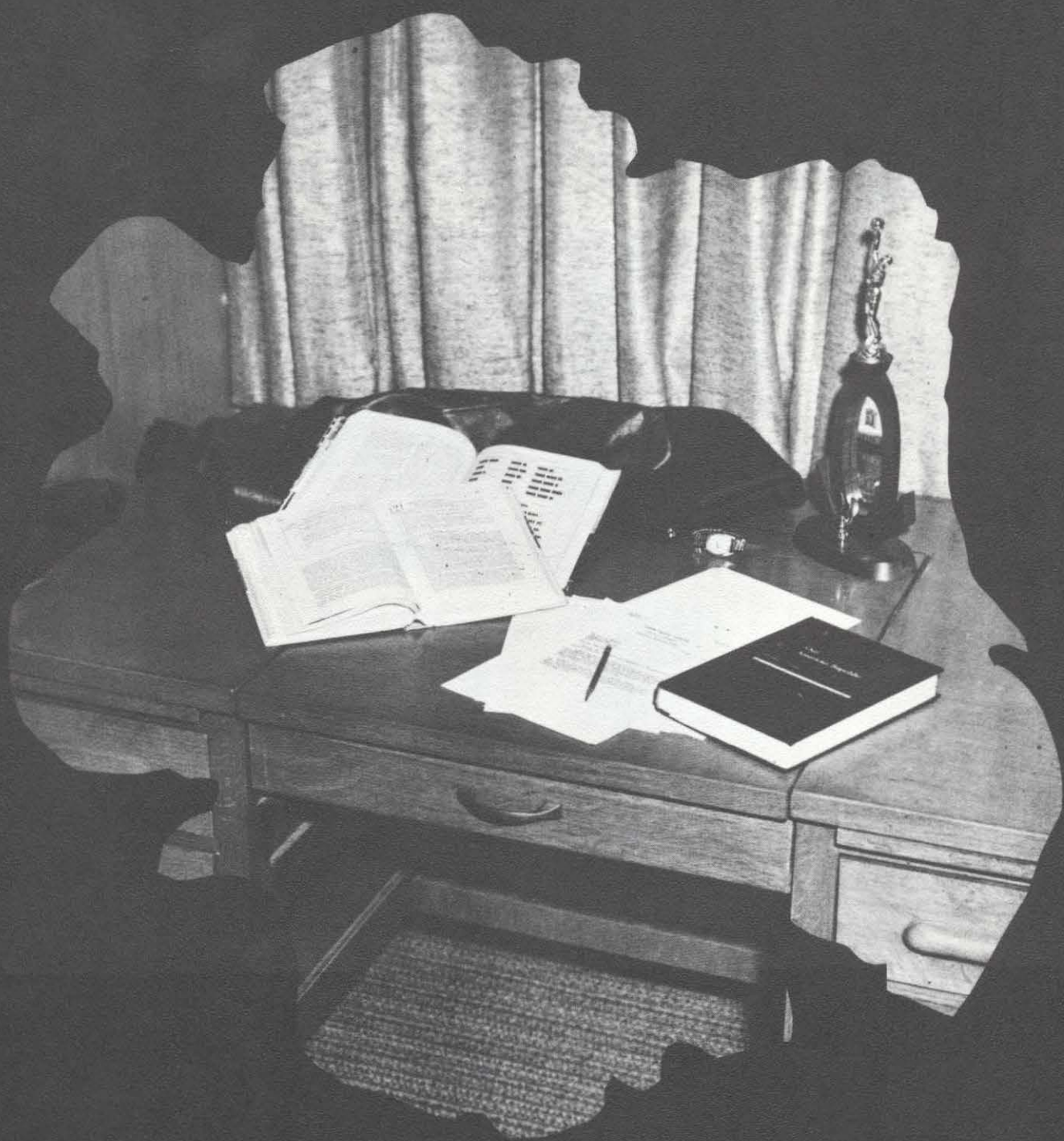


Getting ready for a school board meeting meant a lot of hard work, but Miny always meets it with a smile.

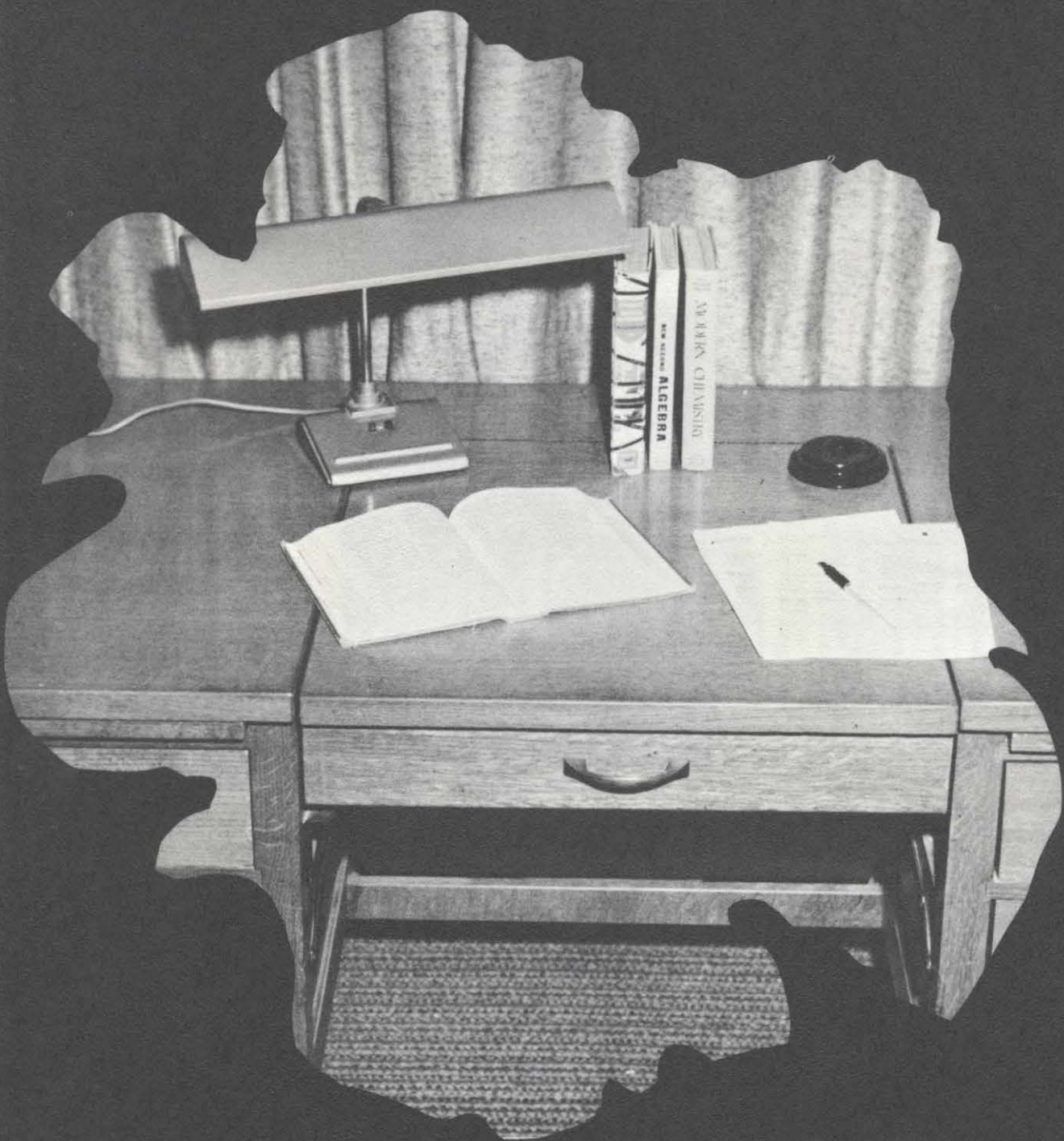

Diagramming a seemingly hard sentence on the board are three of the English I students.



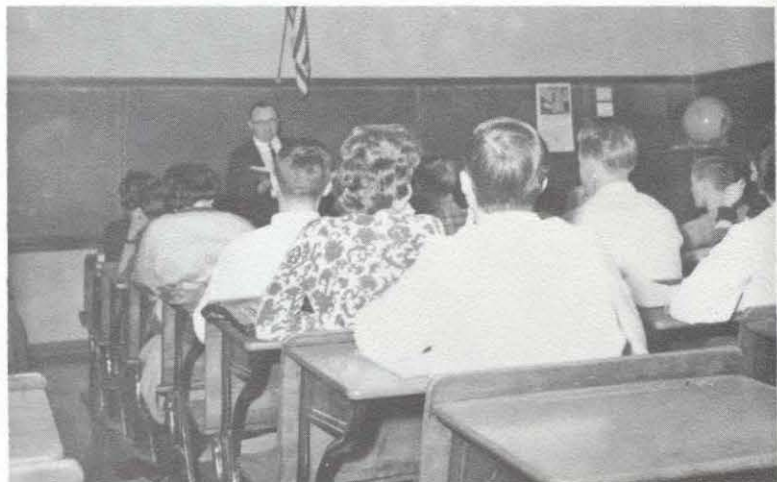
Working on their workbooks seems to be quite amusing to some of the English II class, but to others it seems quite important.

Here we find the Steno II girls busy at filling out forms. The forms are like the ones they will have to fill out when they are employed in a business firm.



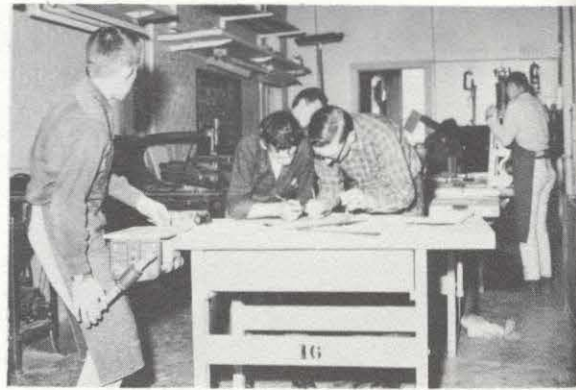

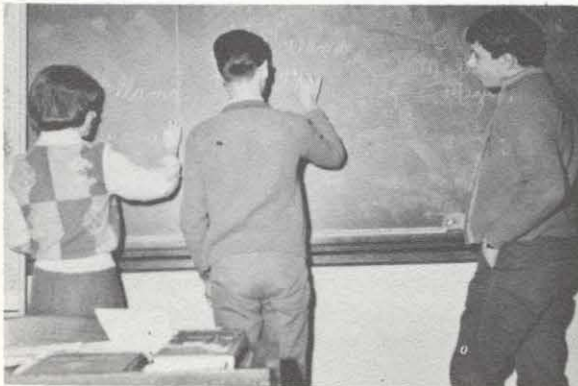
In Shop I and Shop II the boys learn to work with different materials and equipment. They learn to put these skills together in a most efficient manner.

Mechanical drawing is a class in which the students learn to make accurate scale drawings.

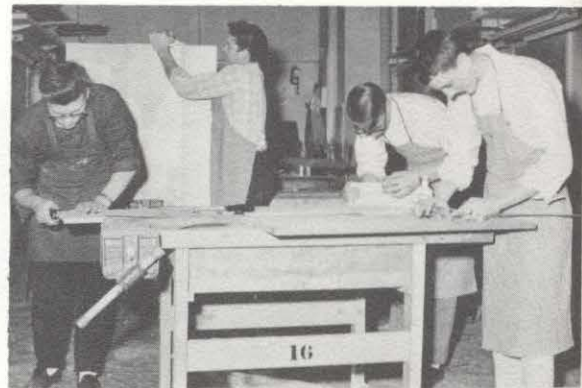
Spanish classes are to acquaint the students with a foreign language.

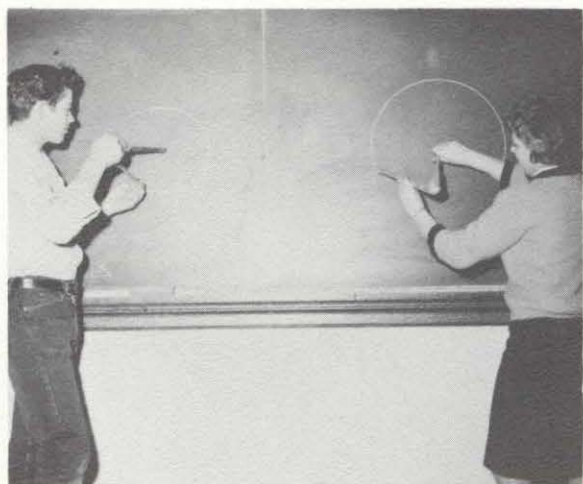

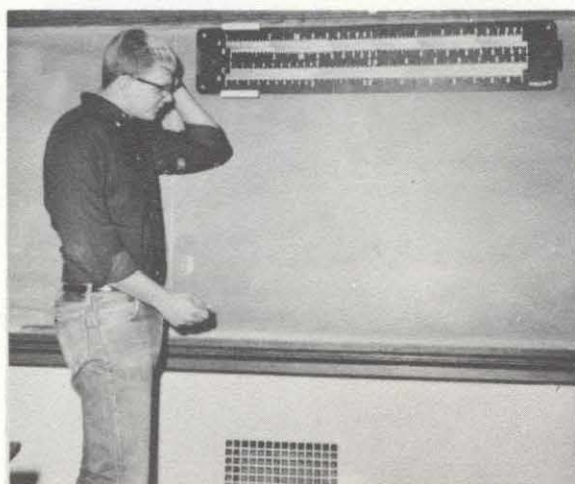

Mrs. Covault teaches algebra, geometry, and advanced algebra. Under Mr. Pickard we learn to use math analysis, trigonometry and general math.



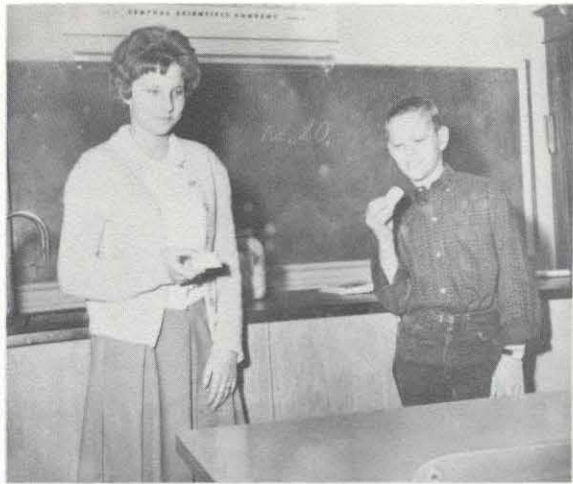

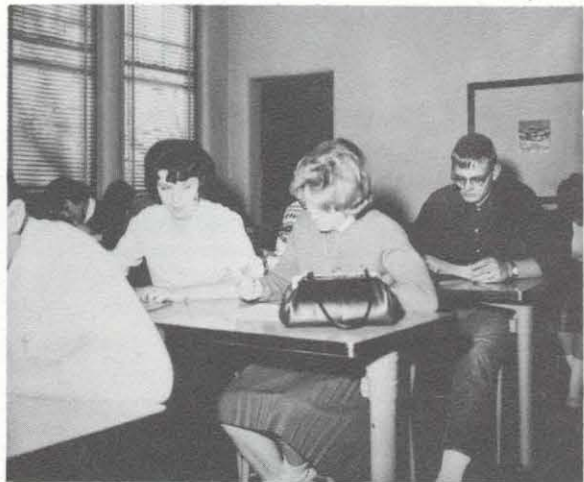

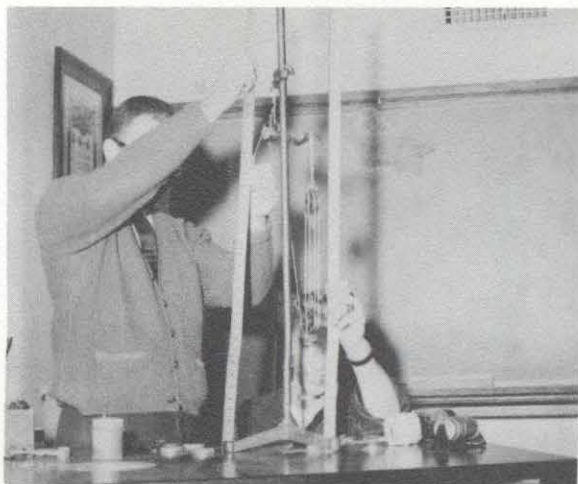

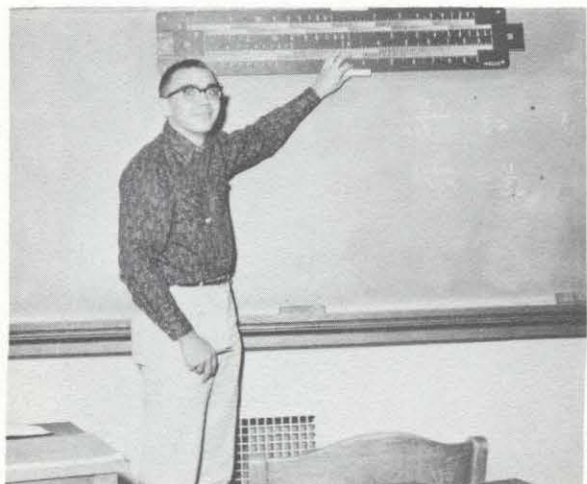

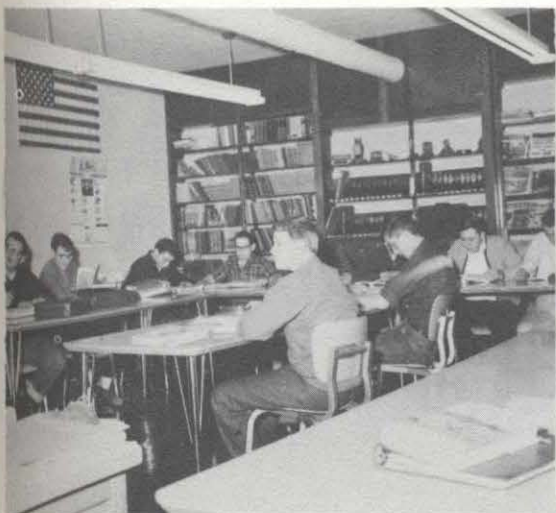

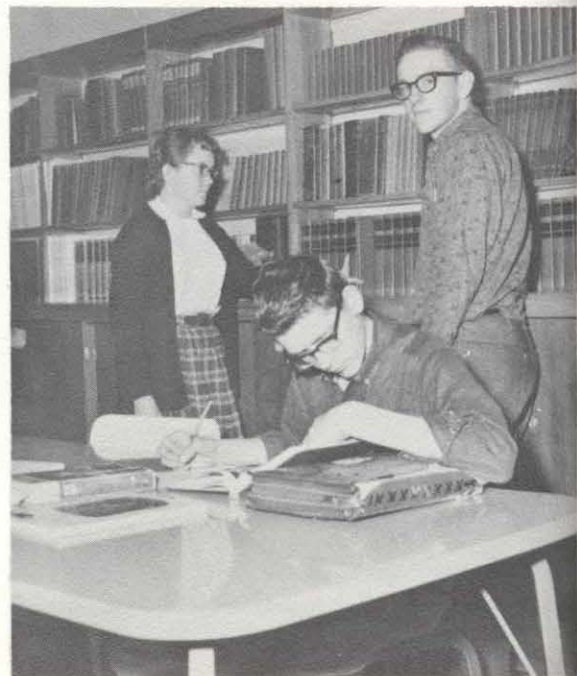

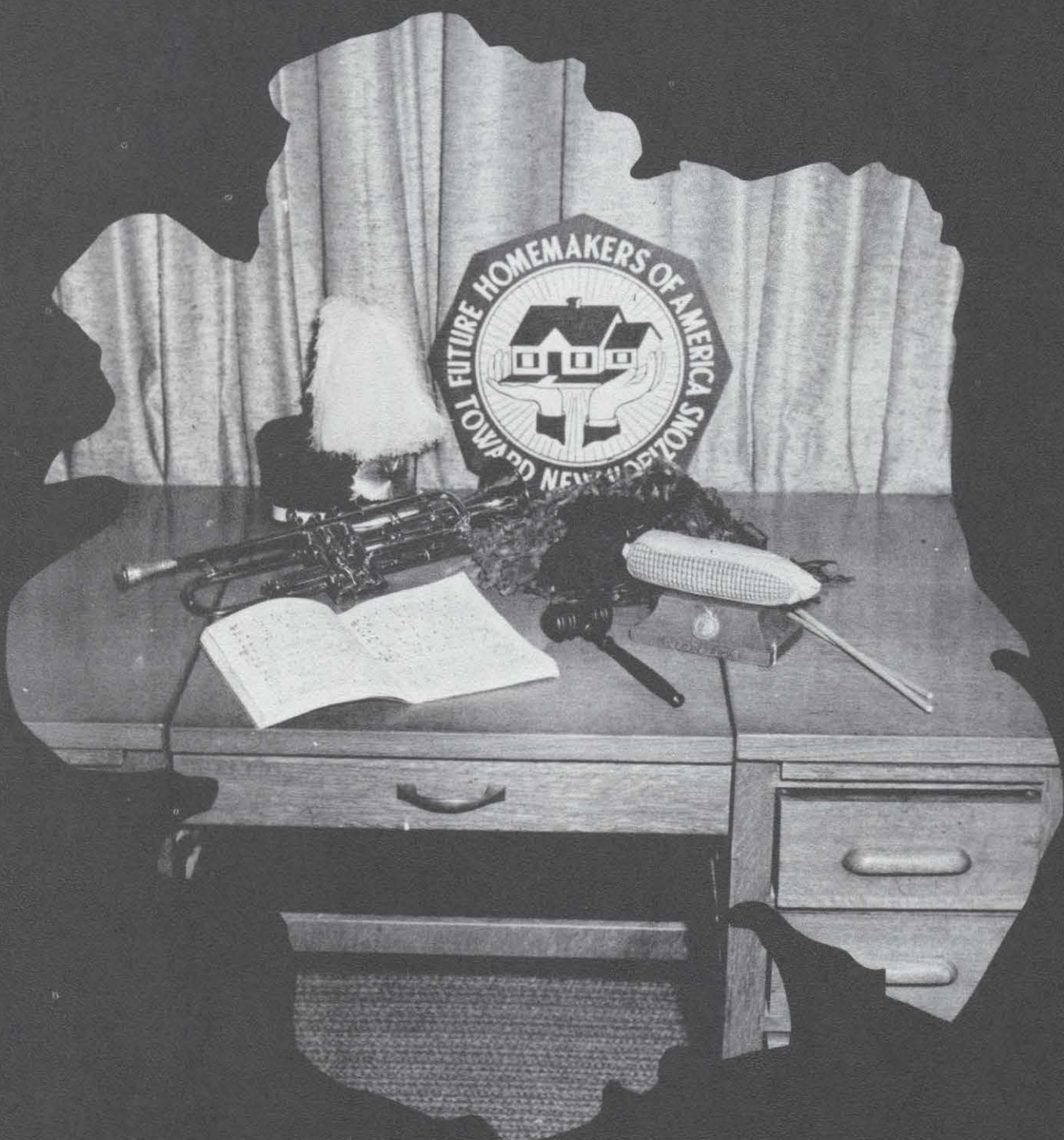
