






VOC. AG. AND IND. ARTS At D. C. H. S., the boys can learn many useful things about a farm. In vocational agriculture, they can learn about soil conservation, farm budgeting, proper animal care, mechanical repair, and various other things. Mr. Naber teaches the three Voc. Ag. classes. Shop I and Shop II are also offered at David City. The boys learn to work with wood and they also get to make projects which gives them good experience in constructing objects on their own. Mr. Retzlaff, the Shop teacher, sees to it that everything is made correctly. Mr. Retzlaff also teaches Mechanical Drawing, a class in which students draw various designs and structures.


