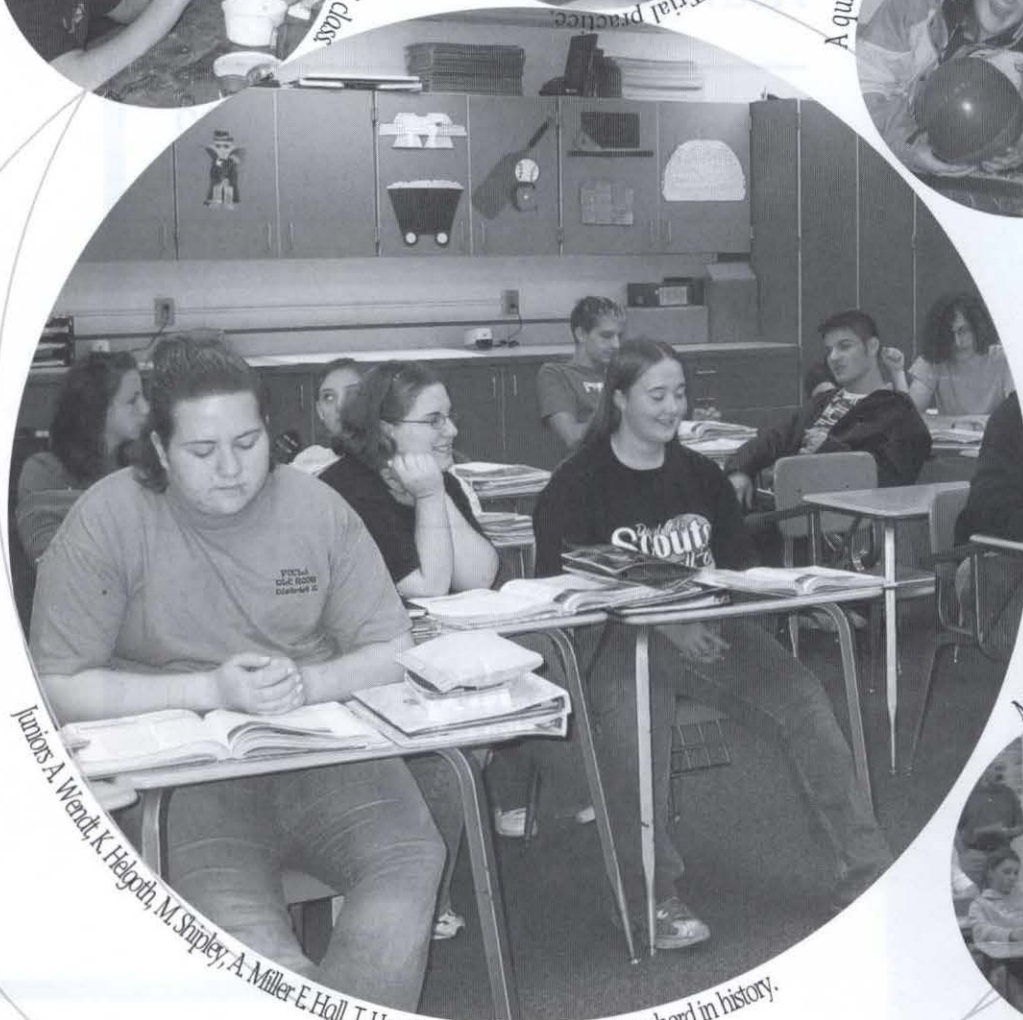

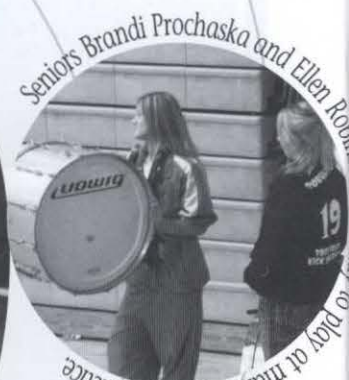

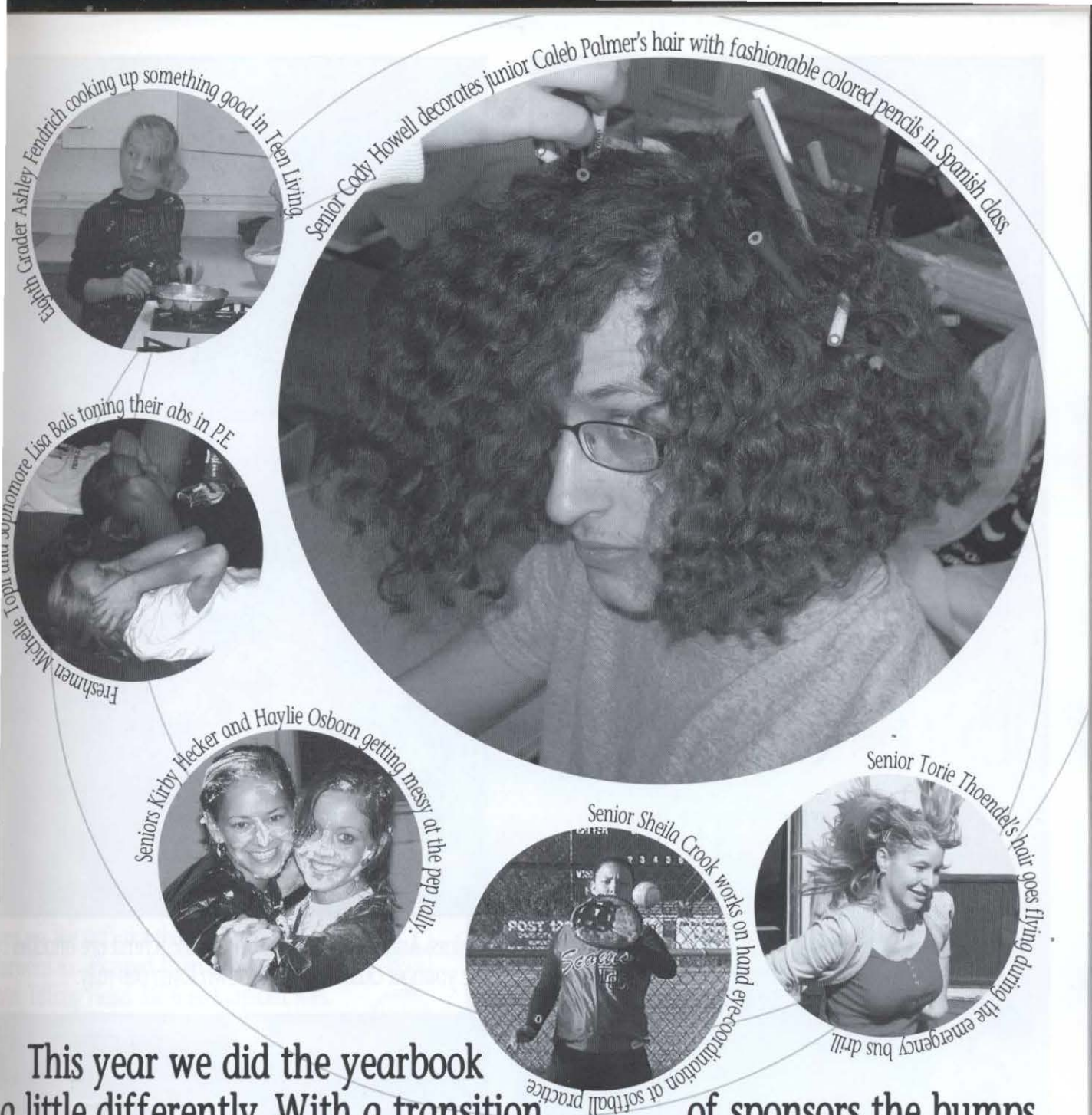

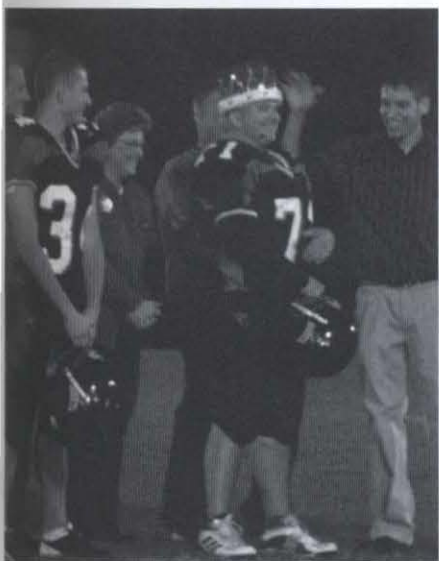

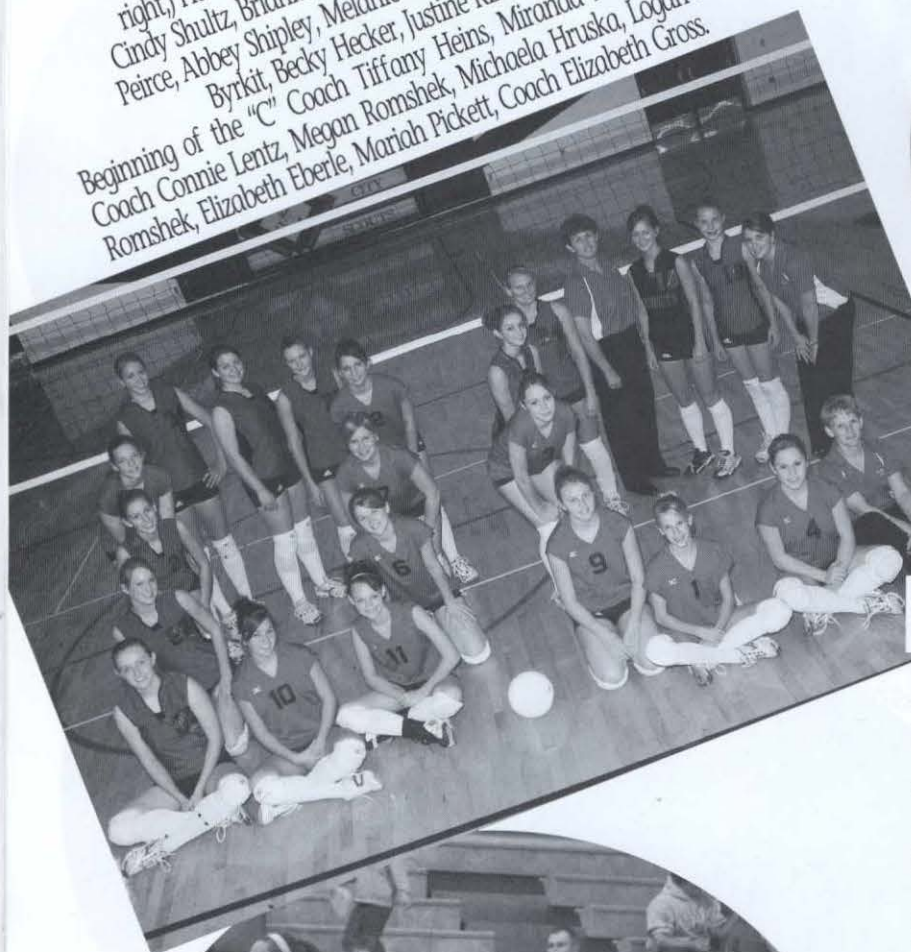

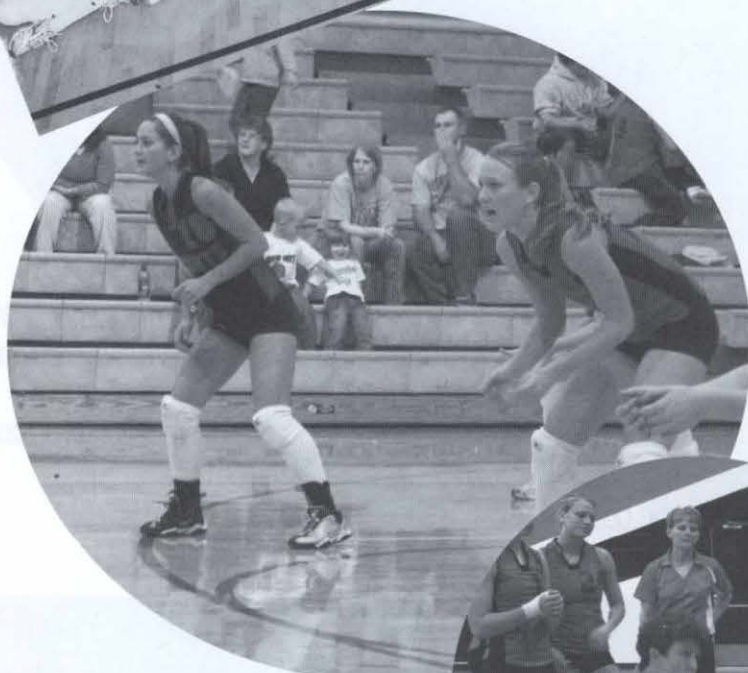

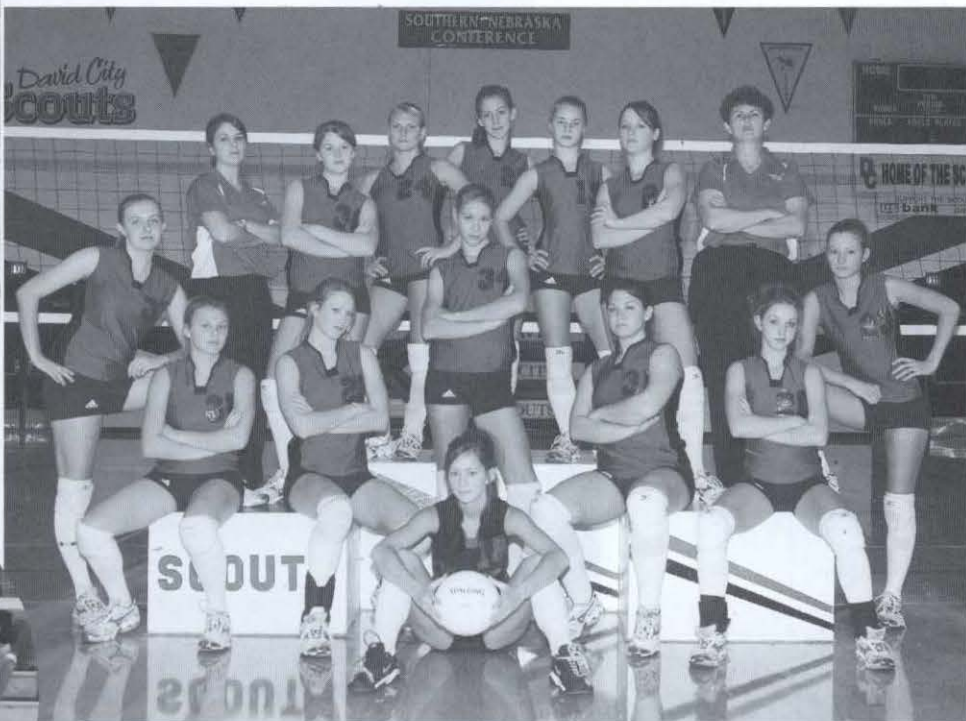

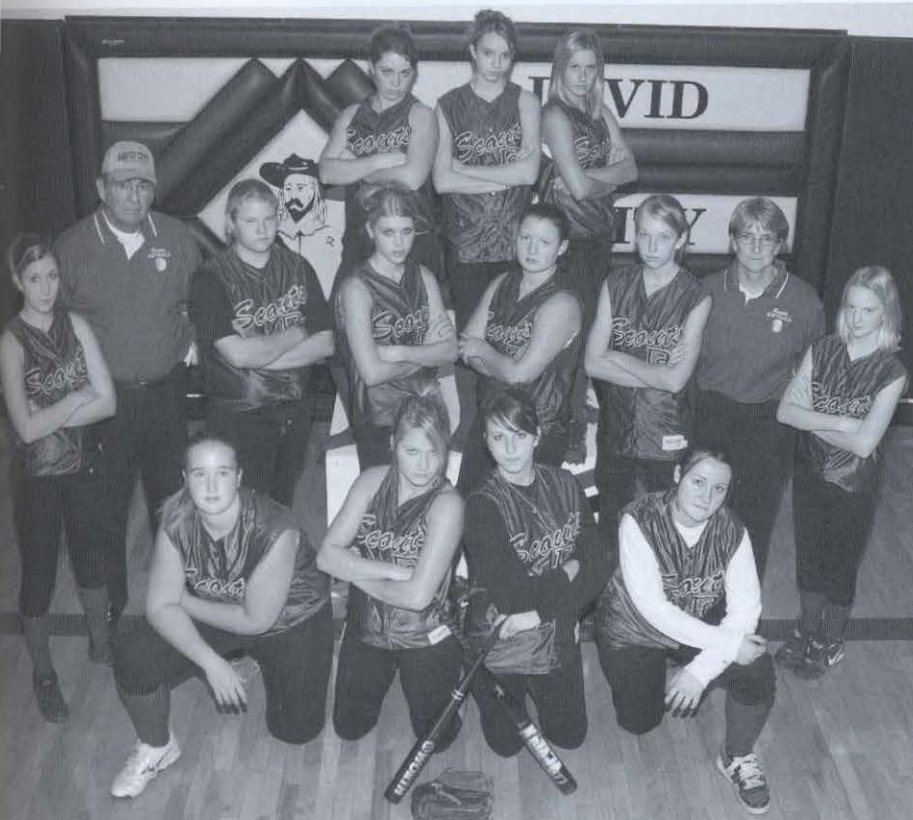

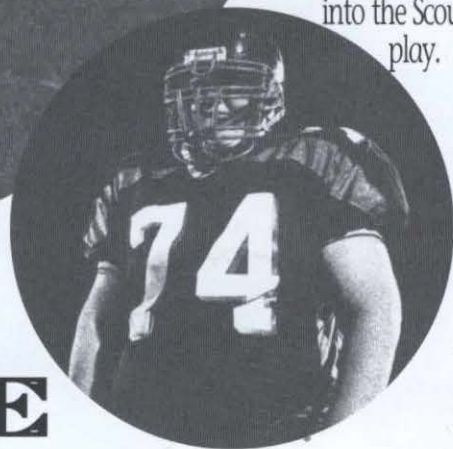

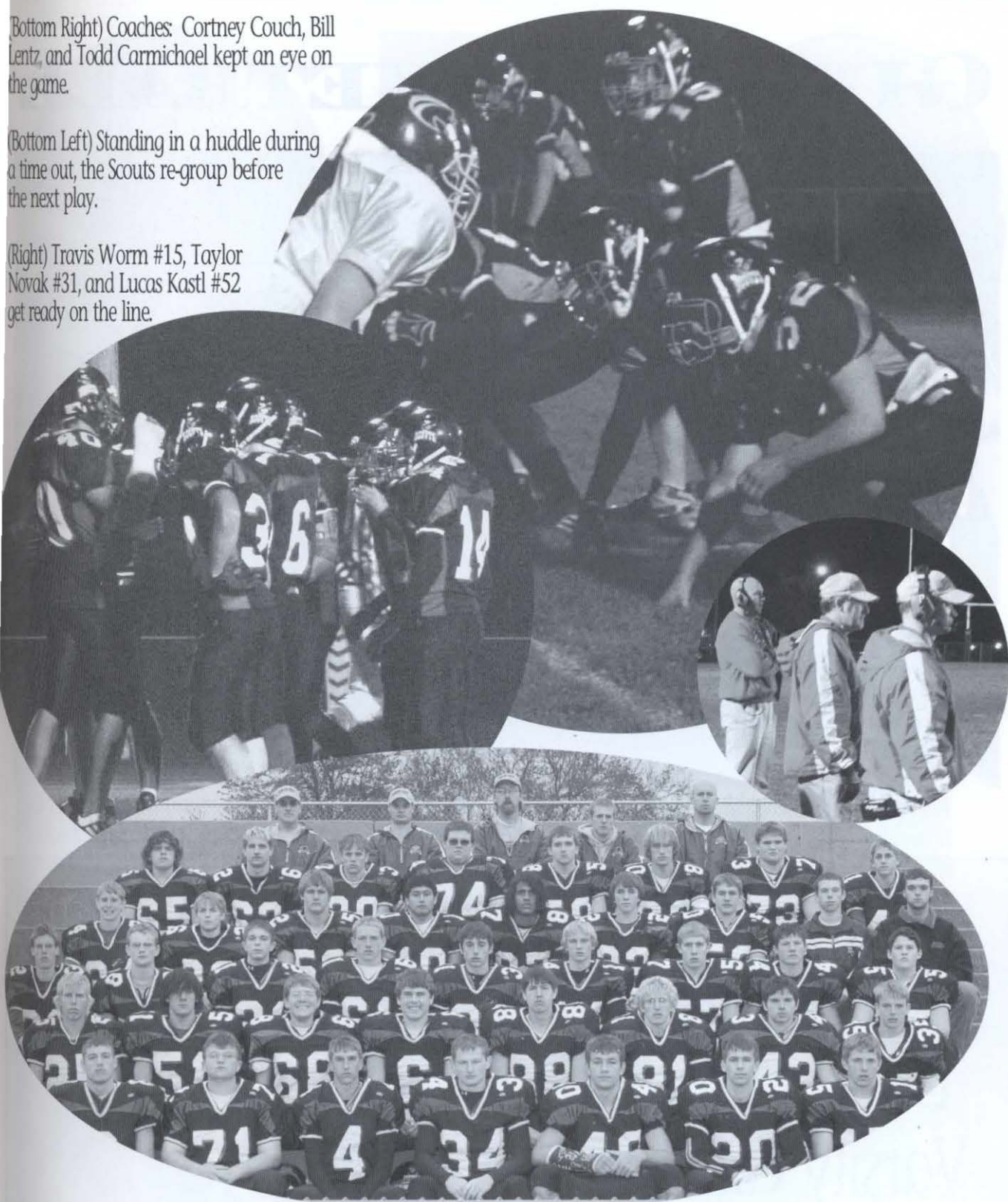
BUILDING A FUTURE

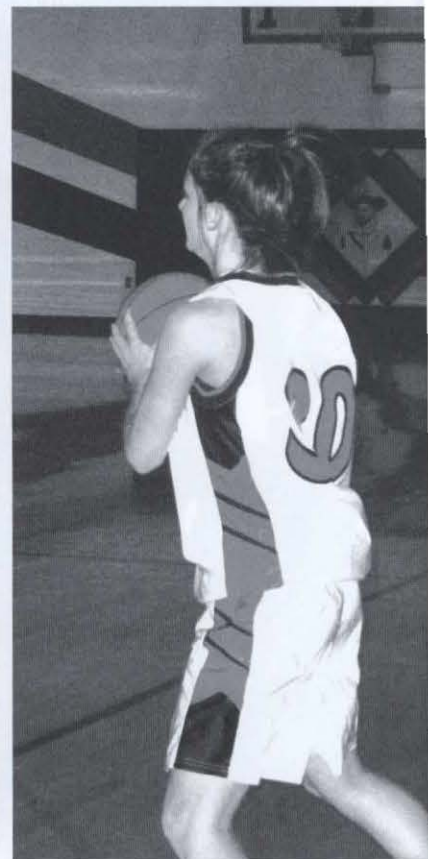

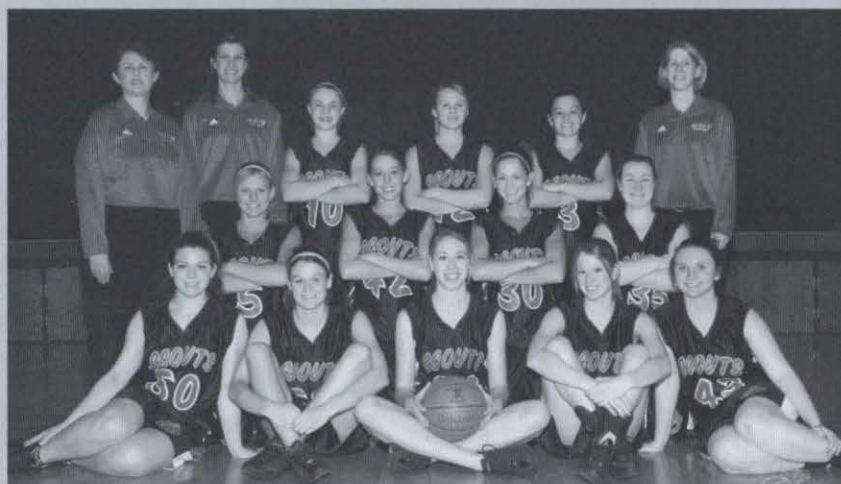

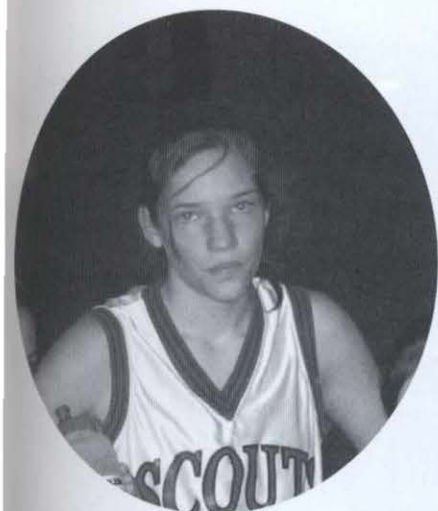

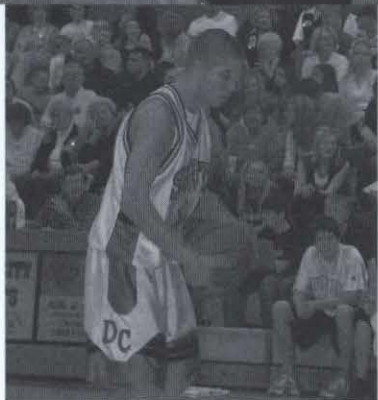

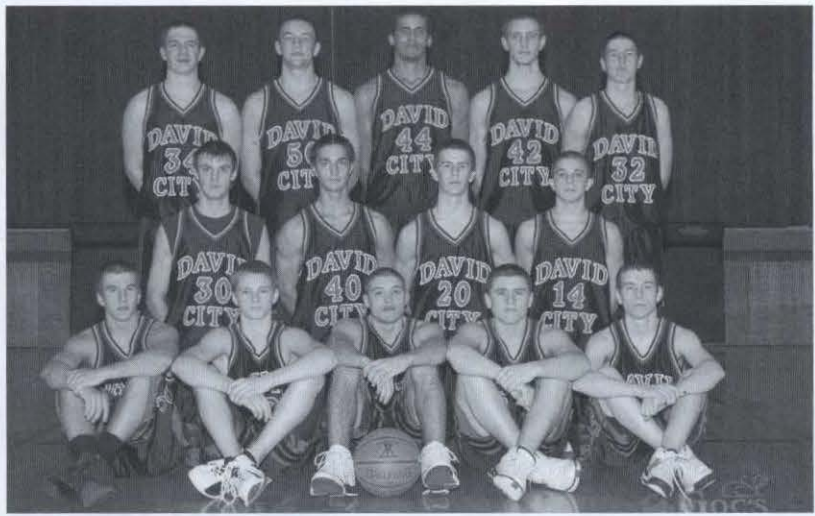

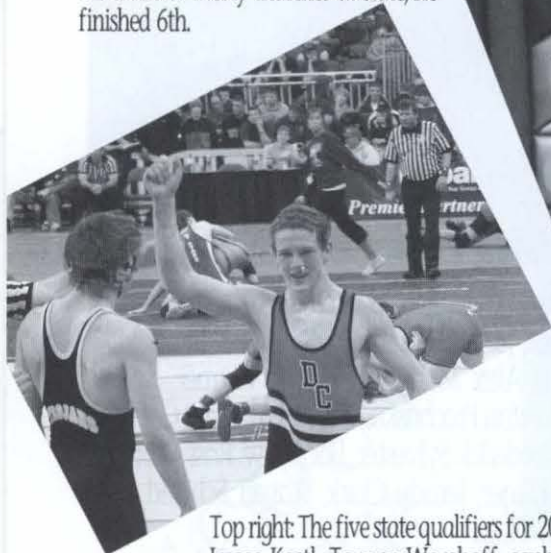

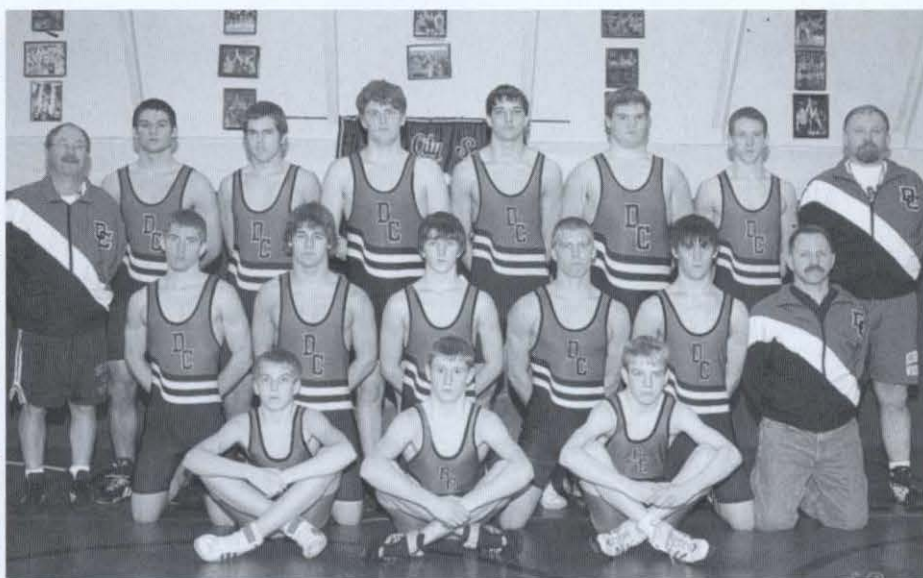

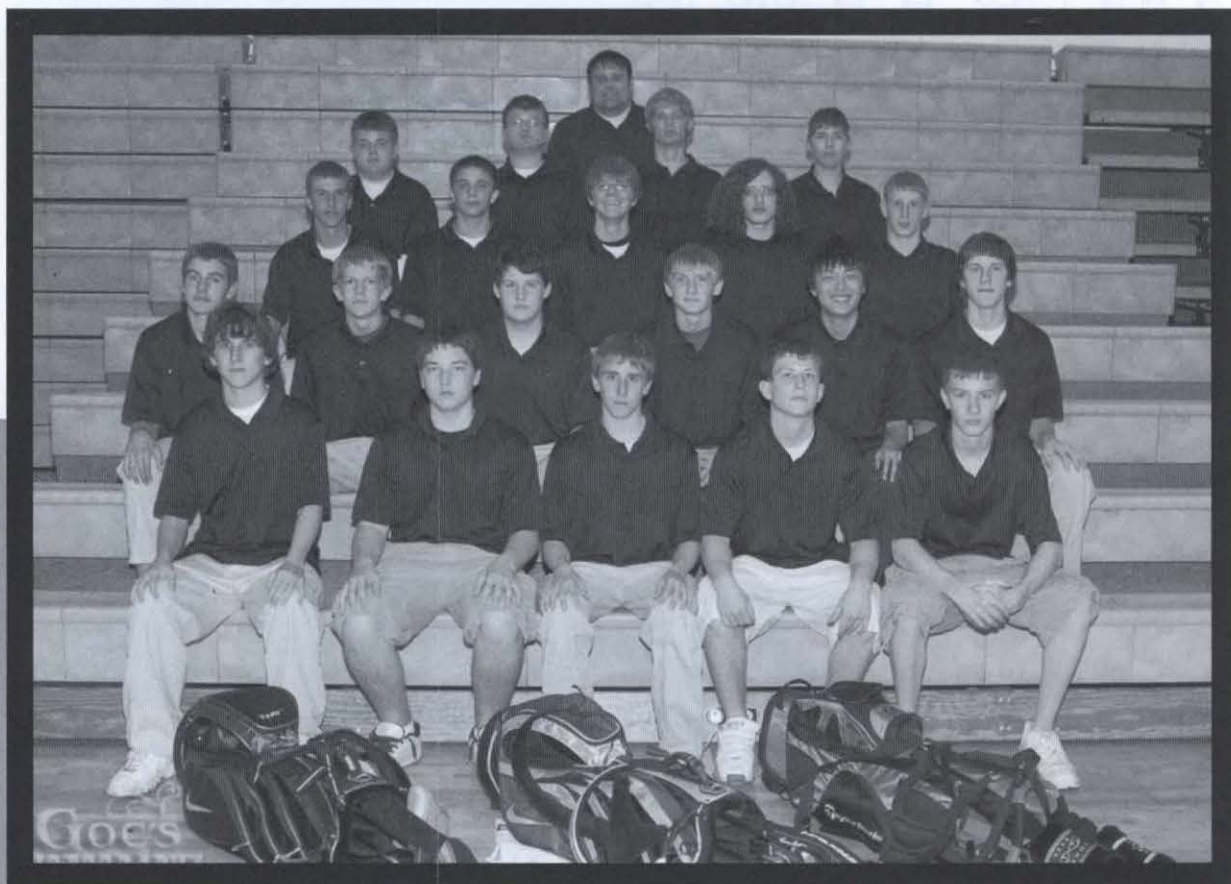

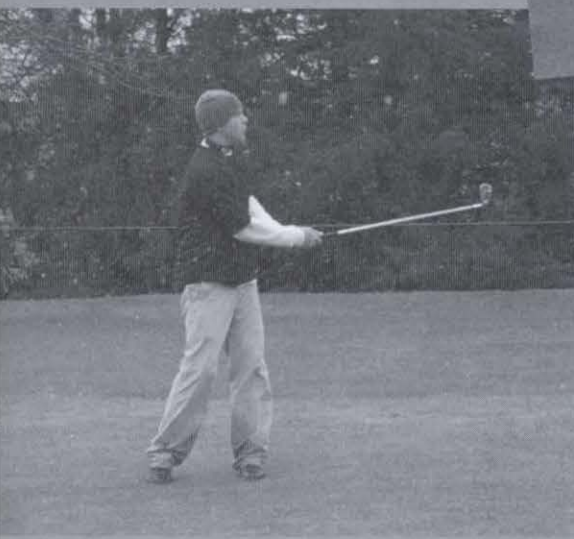

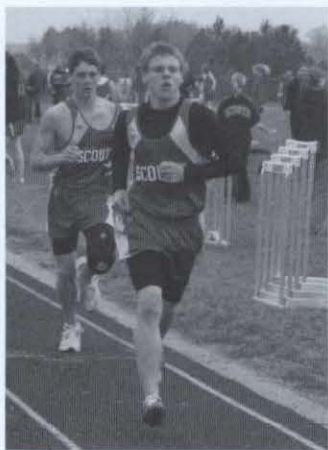

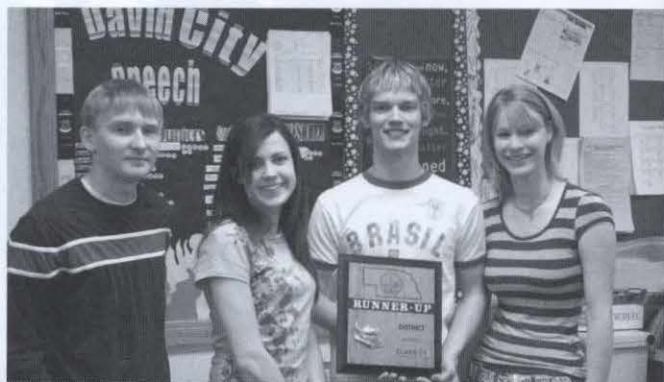

Soon after the loss of the first coach, we were assigned a new one, Mr. Ed Sieck. He helped get the team back on track and to the competition in one piece.

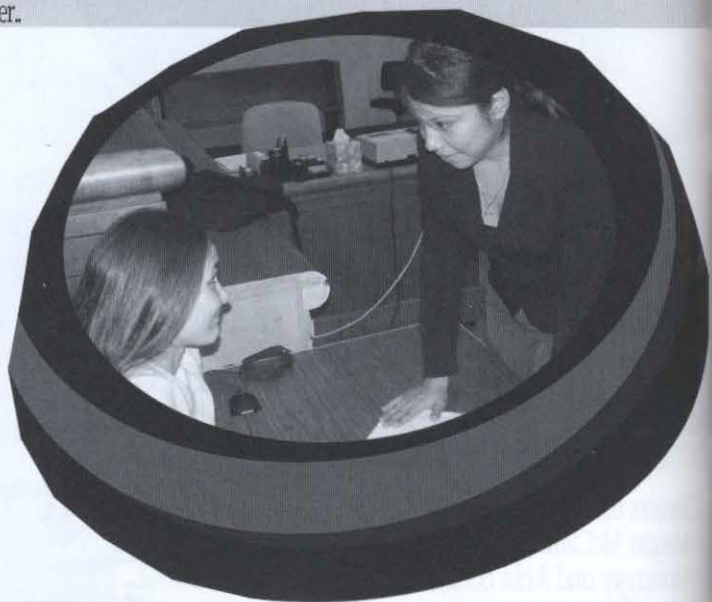

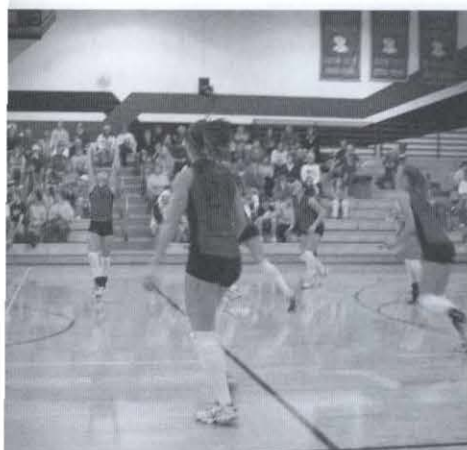

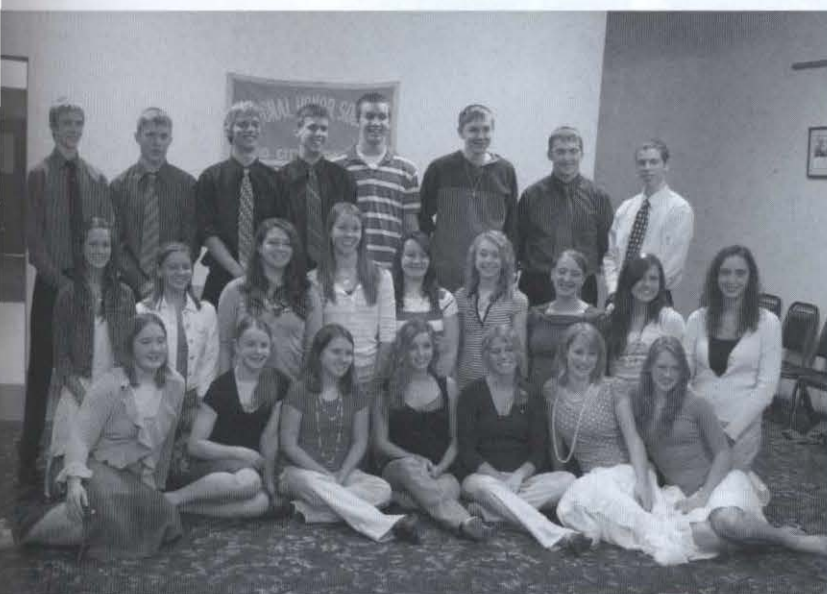

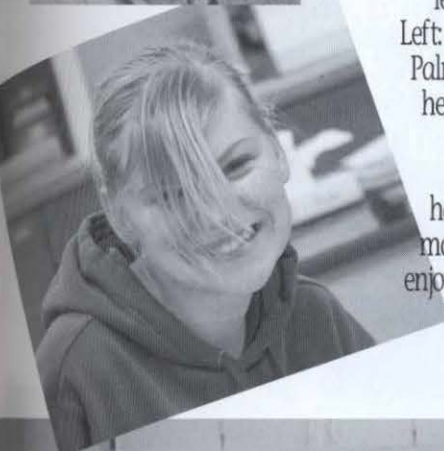

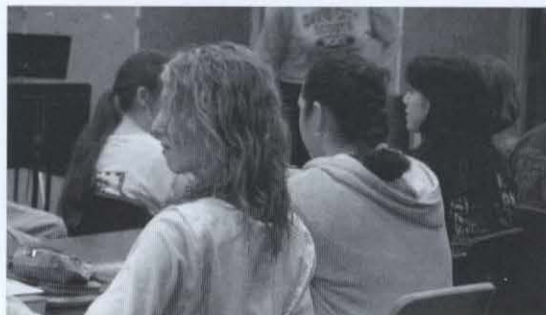
HISTORY

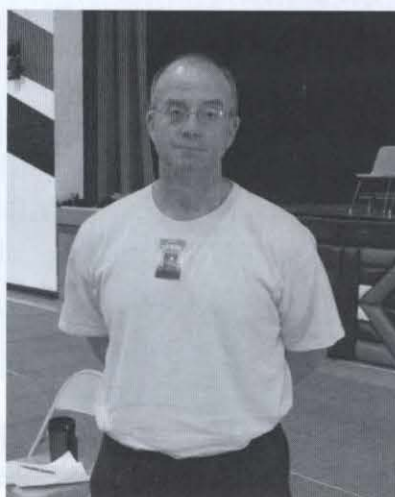

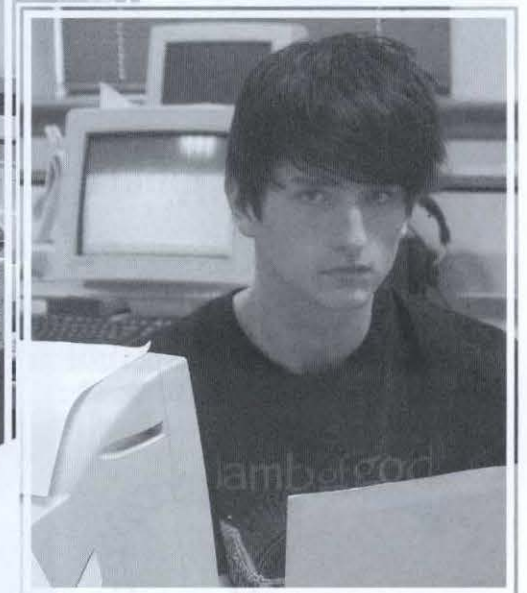

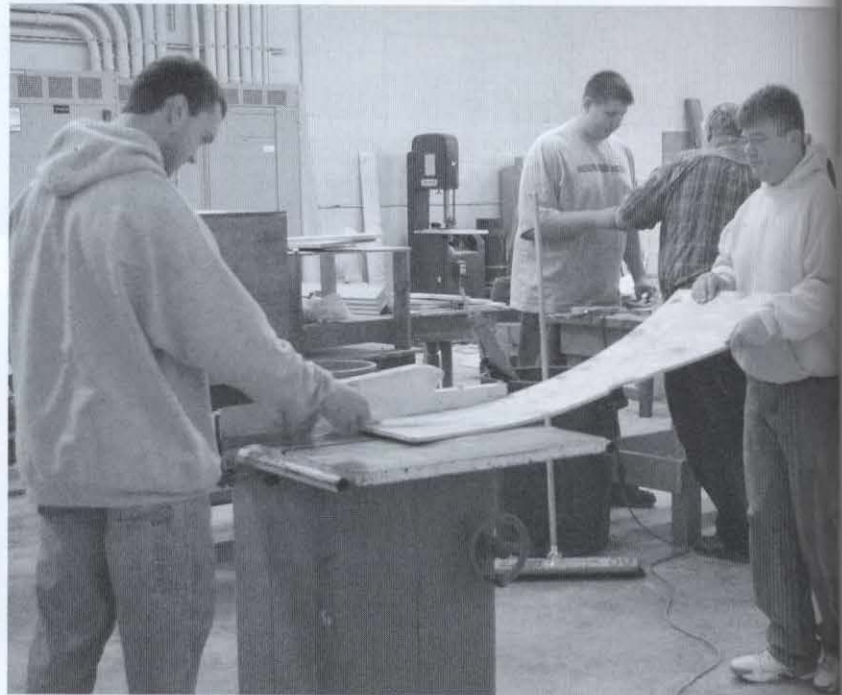

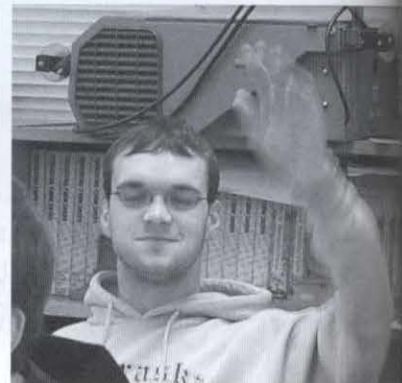

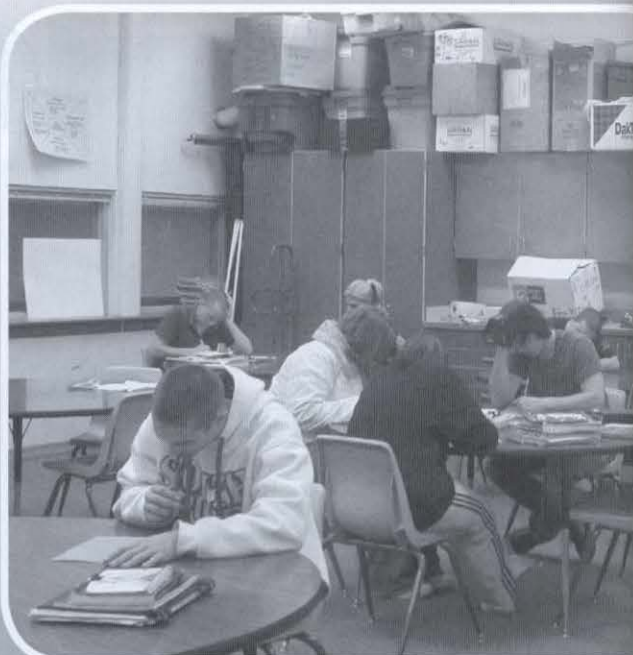

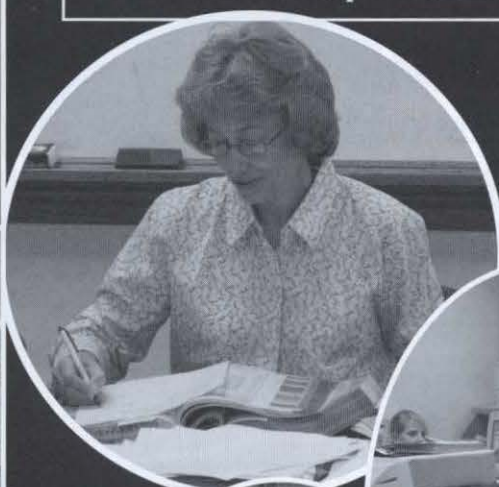

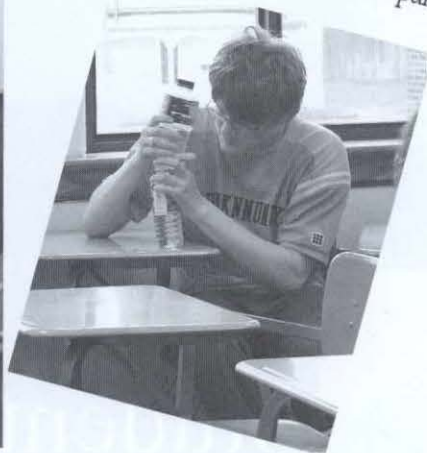

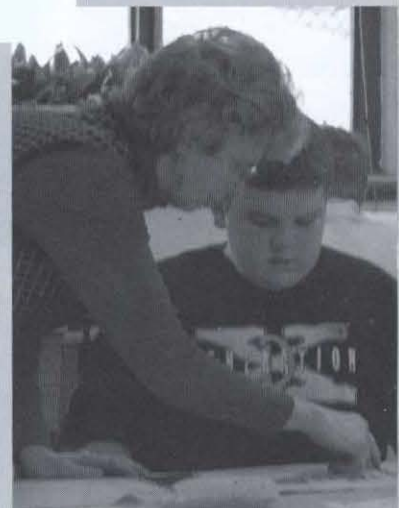

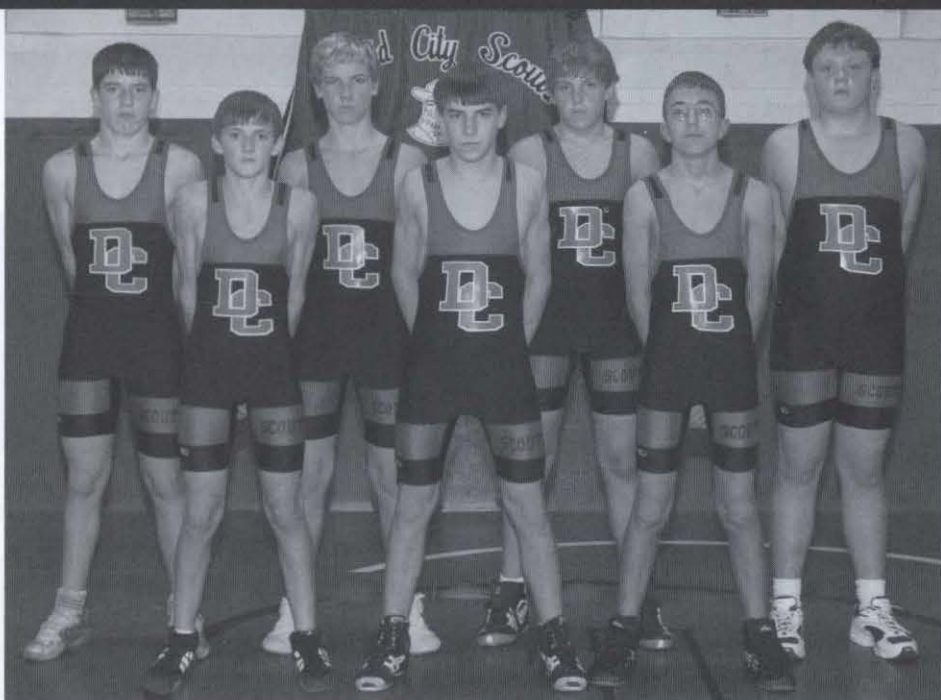

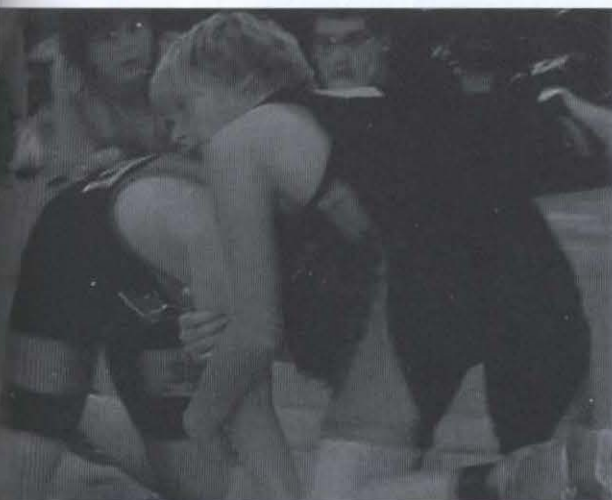

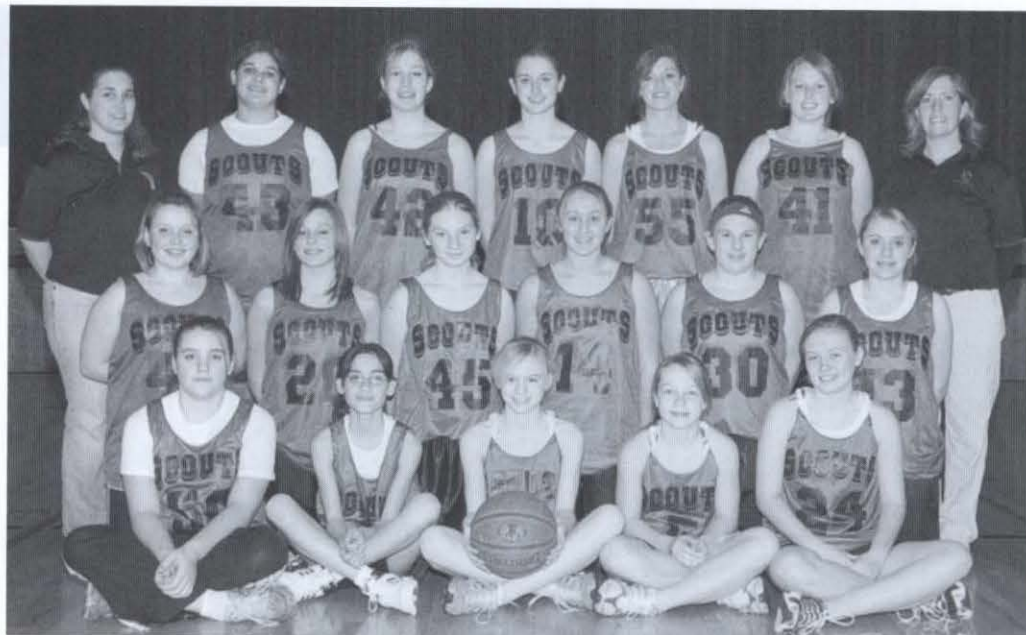
