




coach Cortney Couch pumps up his Scout offense just before the half ends as they compete in the first round of the State Playoffs, This has built a very positive boost of moral for the football team.



ball inside and get fouled. We had two glaring weaknesses. We were not a good three-point shooting team and we didn't defend the three-point shot very well.


Q. What were some turning points in the season?


Q. How have times changed since when you were playing?


