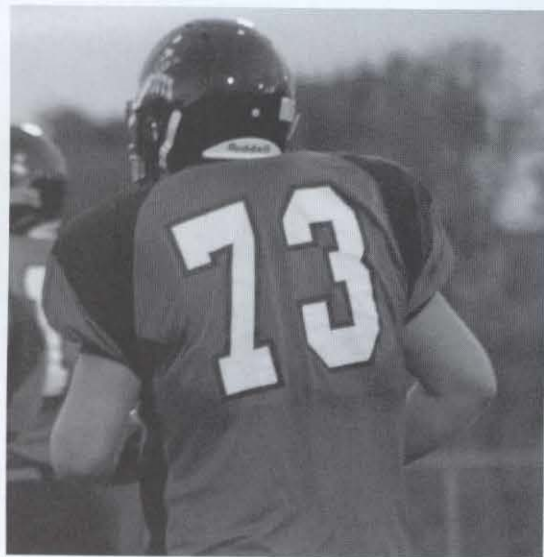

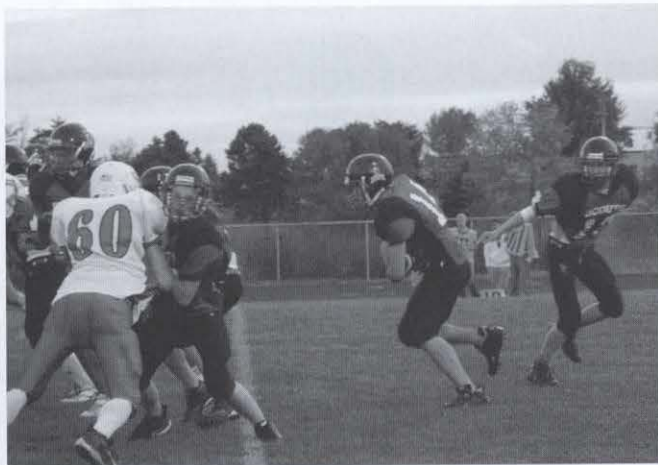

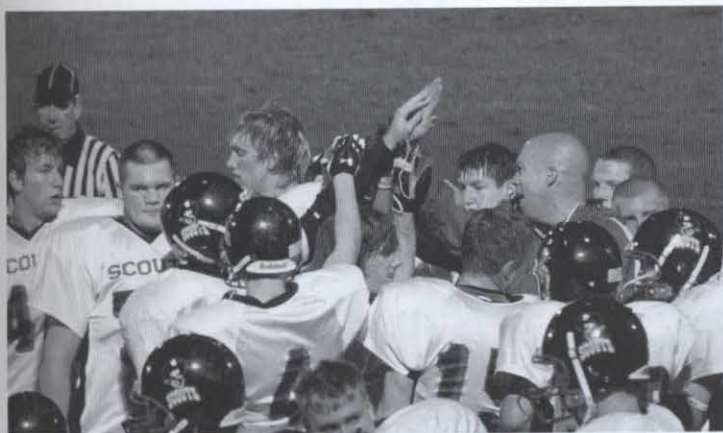

Q. What were the teams' strengths and weaknesses?

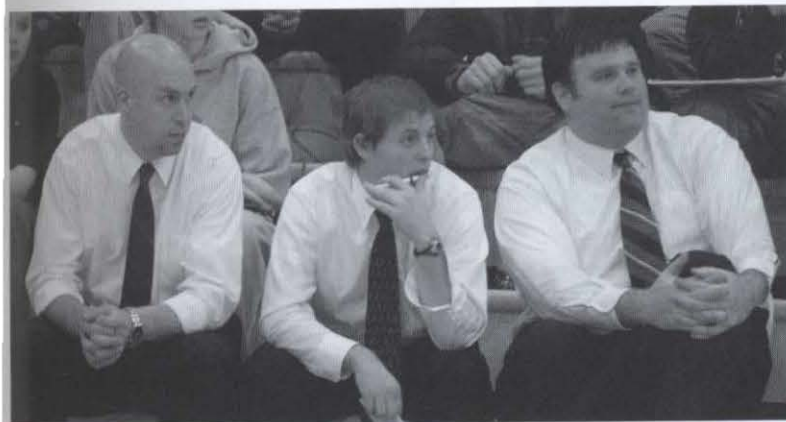

Q. What were some turning points in the season?

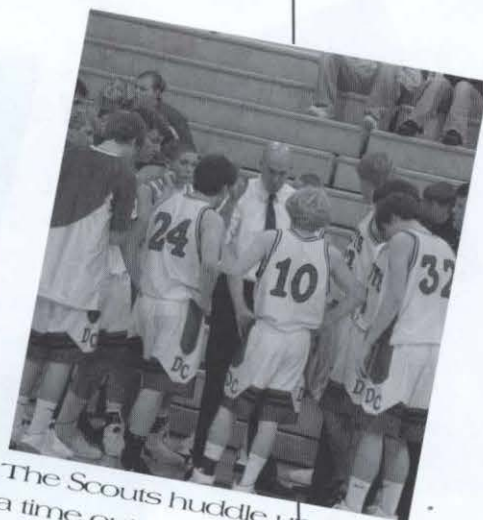

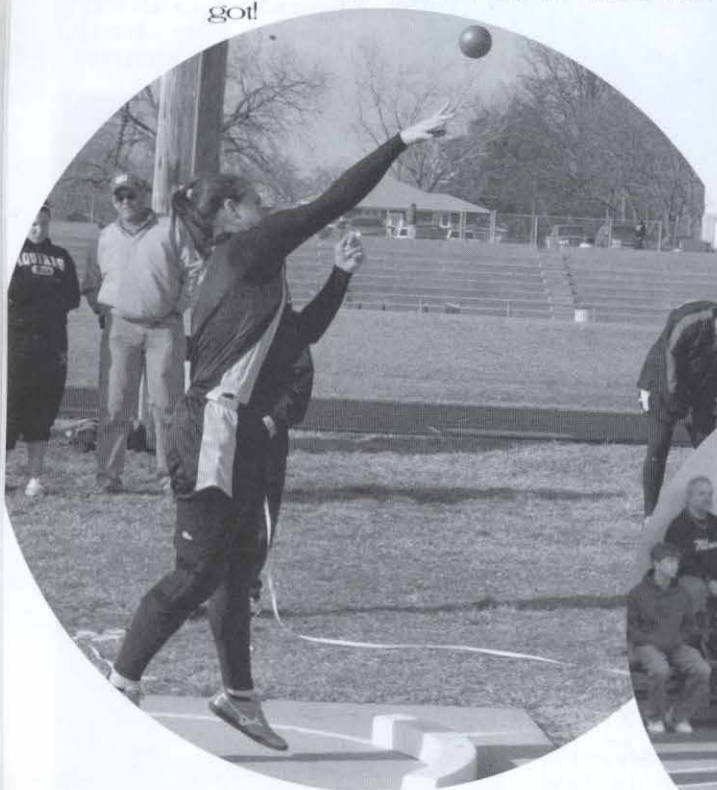

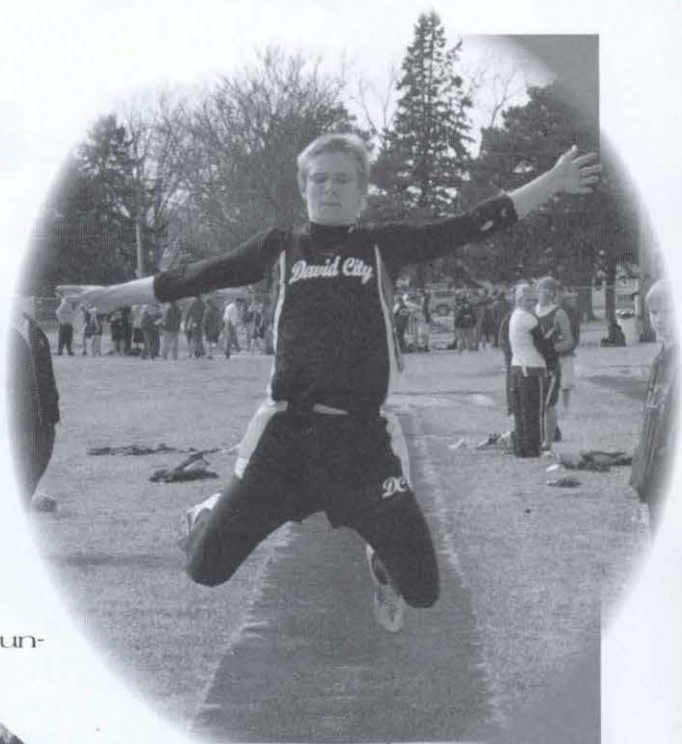

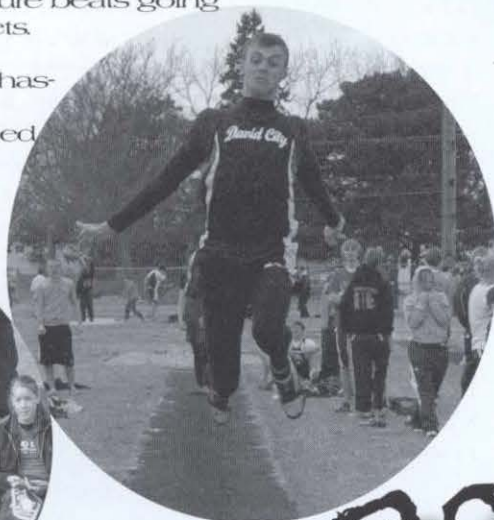

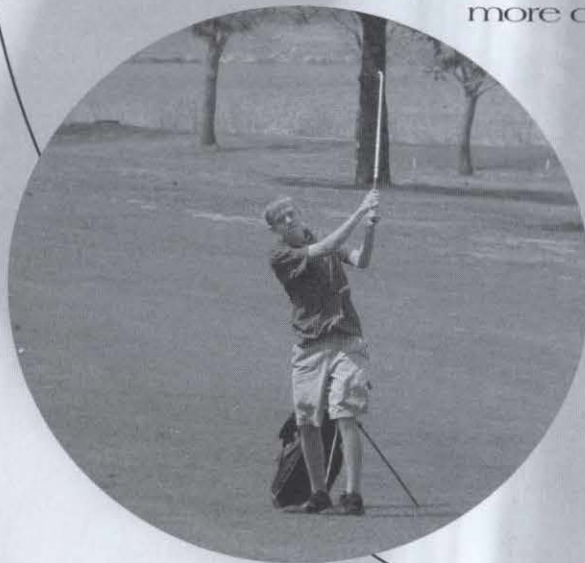

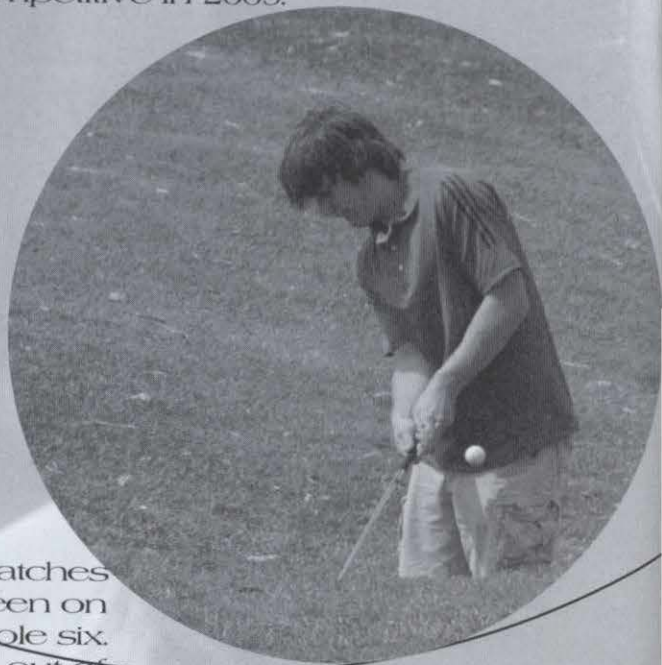
Season Report

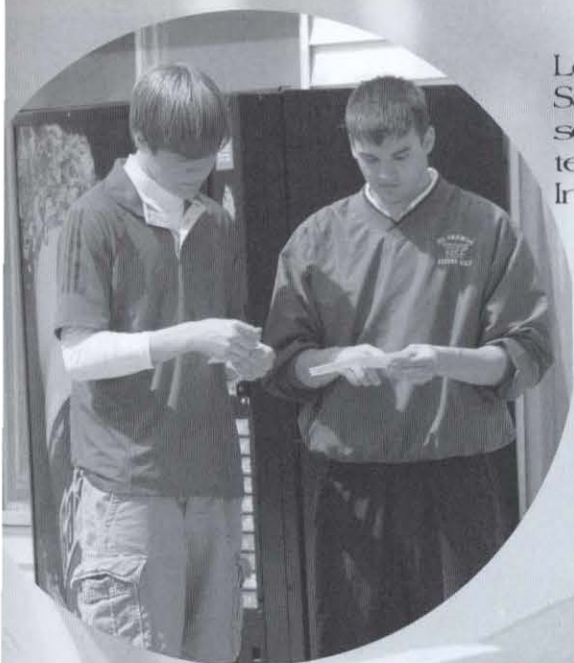

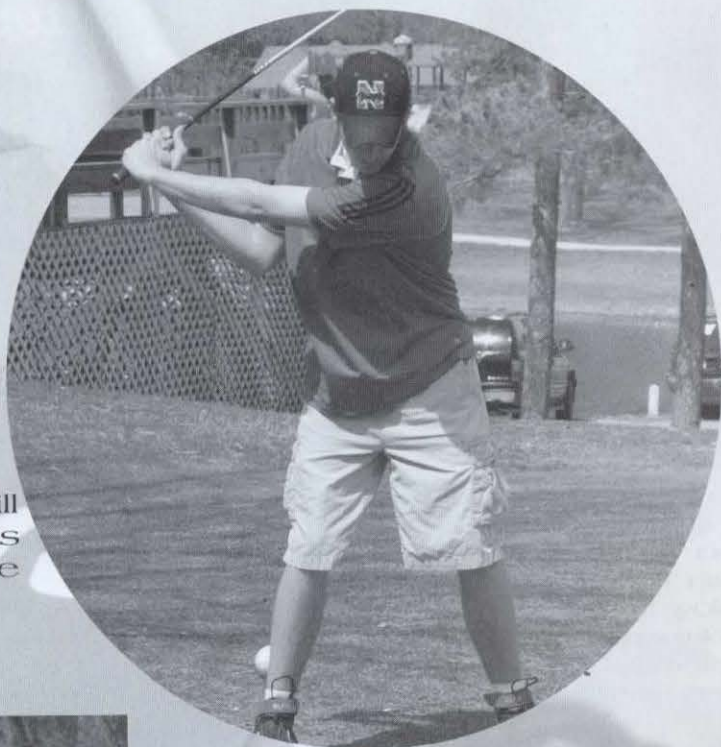

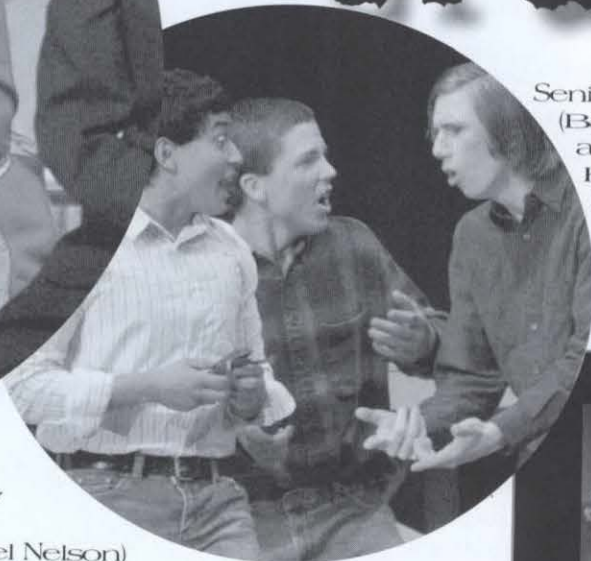

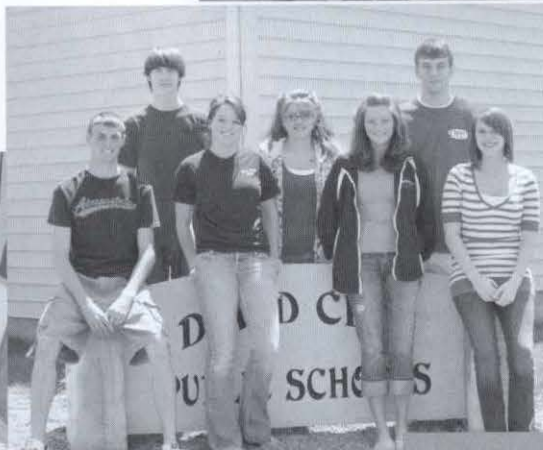

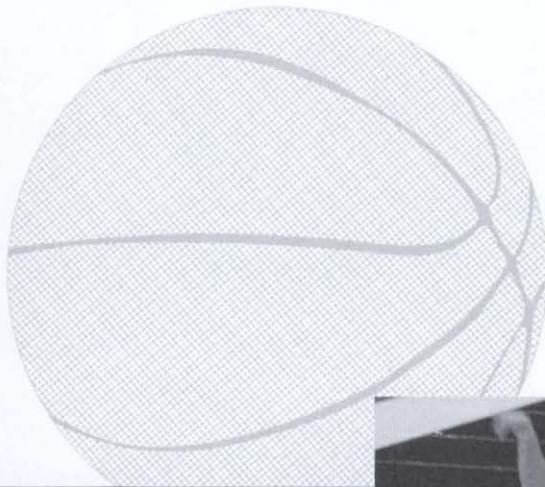

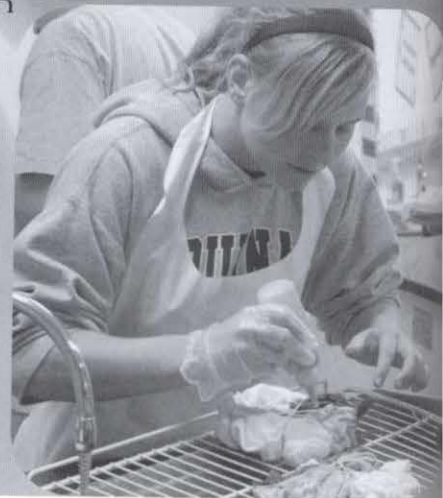

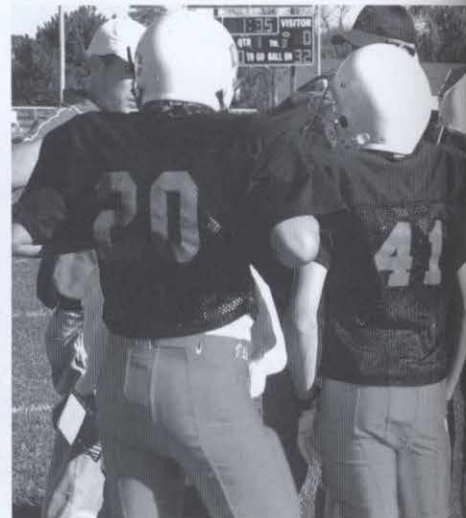

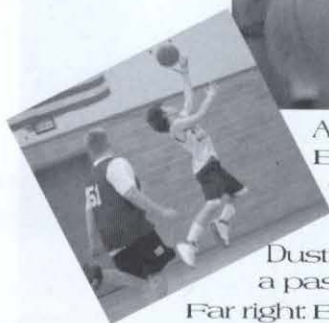
