
There wasn't enough time to do everything that you dreamed of. But the times you did you remember and they put a smile on your face. This is why this year's theme was chosen.






classes stated that their favorite part of the class is the diversity of projects that they get to do in her class, although some of the students don't like working with the Apple comput-
















































