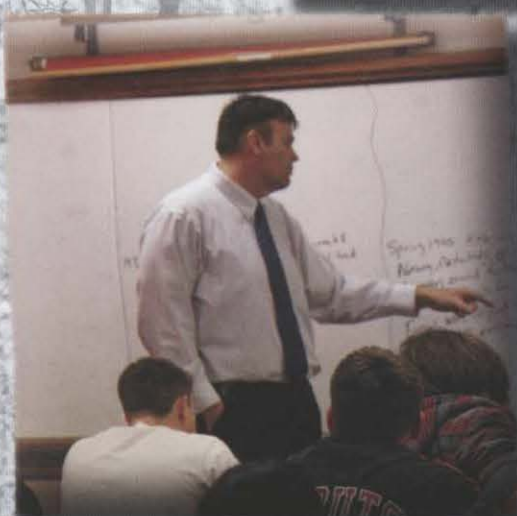

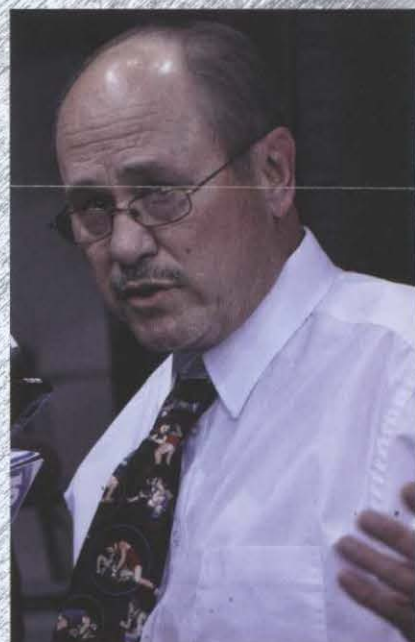


# Coach Kamrath

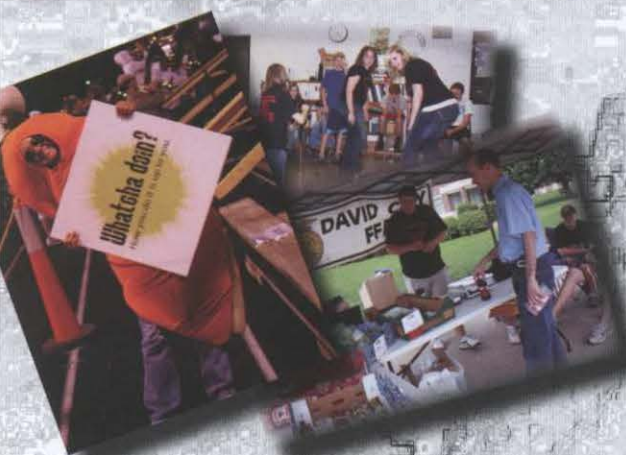

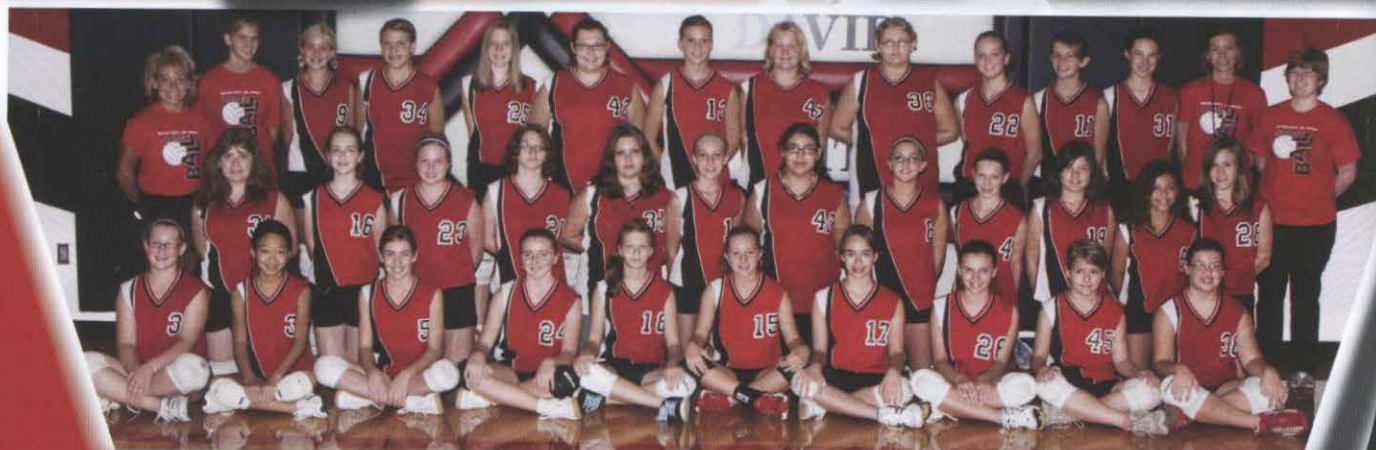

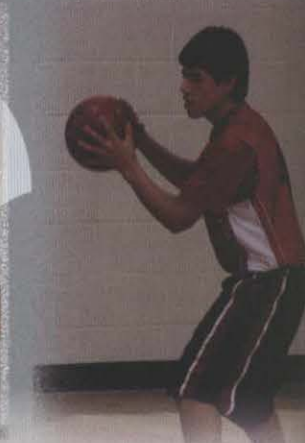
